



Southeast Dairy Business Innovation Initiative Georgia and South Carolina

While SDBII grant opportunities were originally available to Tennessee processors at the start of the program in 2020, the program reach expanded to include the states of Georgia and South Carolina in 2022 and further expanded to offer production-focused opportunities in 2023. Since funding opportunities have been available in Georgia and South Carolina, SDBII has awarded \$3.75 million across 36 grants for production and processing.

Previously Funded Processing Projects in GA & SC:

- Purchase and installation of a bottle filler and capper, labeler, and broiler to increase processing outputs
- Purchase of a health monitoring system, silage loader, feed pusher, and wash sprayer to improve herd health and labor efficiency
- Purchase and installation of automatic calf feeders and corresponding ear transponders
- Completion of a feasibility study to assess the effects of launching a value-added dairy business
